and blowing a cold North East Wind
Fred cutting firewood it's now about
1 foot of snow and very cloudy to night

Fry 8 6 below this morning a fine clear
day Fred cutting firewood very cold
this evening 2 below to night

Sat 9 22 below this morning cold and clear
all day I drove over and got to the bank
+ but it did not get to the River by the evening

Sun 10 Cold and stormy, 22 below this evening

Mon 11 33 below this morning cold and clear all day
a dance in town to night

Tue 12 10 below this morning mild all day
Blowing a ~~South~~ West Wind Fred cutting
fire wood very mild to night John

Wed 13 John's garden settling along with the bank
leaving very mild Fred cutting the mail
very mild to night John's garden

Thu 14 Blowing a strong chinook wind all day
a lot of snow gone the hills are bare
and still thawing bright and very clear

Fri 15 Continues very mild sunny, strong
the snow going fast but in woods
Sycamore but a dust of snow
