- Thur 19 A fine clear day the Americans are busy hauling their freight some of them are hauling freight to Ft Nelson
- Fri 20 Cold this morning Duncan & Bill Pike left for Siskina by truck they took 2 teams of dogs along with them. Mr McKeen D.S. is with them they are to look for a good road way to Siskina & Ft Nelson
- Sat 21 Blowing a cold North Wind with snow Angus went for the mail Very cold this evening with snow 15 below to night
- Sun 22 22 below this ^{morning} and blowing a cold North Wind 2 miners left by plane for Laird River to Brassuit
- Mon 23 18 below this morning Angus took some mail to town cloudy towards noon and started to snow and blowing a N.E. Wind
- Tue 24 10 below this morning but fine and warm towards noon
- Wed 25 5 below this morning but a fine clear day Angus went over and got the mail
- Thur 26 A fine clear day and very mild Johnny arrived from Siskina
- Fri 27 A fine mild day Johnny left this morning for Siskina
- Sat 28 a hard frost last night but a fine warm day I drove to town and got the mail the road badly cut by the trucks
