Sat 6 Blowing a North wind but very mild and thawing  
 a number of Air Plants started going North

Sun 7 Cloud and Overcast with snow and rain in morning  
 and a North East Wind. Raining and snowed this evening

Tue 8 Snowed during the night. Very mild this morning  
 Wind from West. Very hot in afternoon

Wed 9 A hard frost this morning. Started to blow a strong  
 West wind. Thawed to some extent in the afternoon
