- Apr 1 A heavy fog 22 Above Zero this morning
Mr. Gribbin a writer called here today he is on his
way to Alaska. Started rain and snow late in night
- Apr 2 Cloudy and Overcast. Rained during the night
blowing a South West wind Very Mild
thawing in the afternoon
- Apr 3 A hard frost this morning and a fine warm
day. Duncan came over and camped for the night
here as before.
- Apr 4 A hard frost. Duncan took a load of sheep home
from Kaniere. Thawing in afternoon
- Apr 5 A hard frost this morning. Blowing a strong West
Wind. Afternoon a lot of snow gone.
