Blowing a chinook wind  
all day the snow melting fast.  
C. Payette passed on his way to  
P. B. King. Mr. Colburn & family  
arrived from Hope where they  
were staying and some other claims.

Wednesday 23

Warm in morning but wind  
changed to the North and turned  
cold towards evening. 2 Indians  
arrived from the North.

4 Teams arrived with freight for  
Mr. Reid.

Thursday 24

Cold. Cadanhead passed on his  
way to Derrigan with 2 teams.  
I shipped the H.B. Pass along  
with him. The Indians left  
this morning. Guys went for hay.

Friday 25

Continues cold. Self at odd jobs.  
Very little doing. The boys cutting  
fire wood.

Saturday 26

2° below this morning. The boys at  
fire wood. Self in office.

Sunday 27

Cold & stormy with snow.

Monday 28

Continues cold. Self & George  
went for a load of hay. J. Apperson  
came in for a few supplies.

Tuesday 29

Continues cold 4° below this morning.  
Not much doing. Self went to the Island  
to look for wood but found very little.
