Cold & stormy all day with
snow self in office the boys
at school

Thursday 7
a fine mild day self in office
George went for a load of hay
one Indian arrived from the north
they are killing very little deer

Friday 8
a fine mild day the mail
arrived at noon a few of the
Settlers arrived from Taylor flat
the Police sent 2 men out after
a Crazy German who went out
of the Indian camp. they caught
him back this evening
2 Indians
arrived from Agassiz Lakes

Saturday 9
Cold & stormy all last night
and fell about 6 in snow continued
morning until noon and then
cleared up George went for hay
Peters arrived from Spent River
and had to leave part of his things
at the N. River snow very deep

Sunday 10
blowing a strong Chinook wind
from the west and snow
drifting hard the N. Hope Mail
arrived this morning

Monday 11
the Mail left this morning for
Hudsons Hope self at school
boys at school
a fine mild day
cloudy towards evening
