(332-34)

Kenney looking after horses
a strong gale of wind all day
2 Indians arrived from
Charles's Camp and brought a
few furs

THURSDAY, 28

(333-33)

Self in store The Indians
left this morning for home
handling hay fire wood Scamson
Very fine weather some all geese
and the River clear of ice
arrived from the half way River on
his way out to Edmonton

November

FRIDAY, 29

(334-37)

1913

Self in office Boys at wood
snow storm all day wind from
the north east very cold
starting to run in the River

SATURDAY, 30

(335-31)

Self in office all day the boys went
for a load of hay fine clear day but
very cold a lot of ice coming in the
River 2 Thomas came up from
the South for a few supplies

December

SUNDAY, 1

(336-30)

The River froze over this morning
20 below zero this morning
towards evening and looks like snow
